Local Volunteer and Donation Opportunities

- MissionSAFE Donation Request; MissionSAFE needs support now more than ever. Their youth and families, who are already vulnerable because of their low-incomes and high rents, face the added economic devastation that comes with the loss of their hourly wage in restaurants, hotels, and construction sites. Because of the Corona Virus, MissionSAFE's traditional springtime fundraising activities can not be held which leaves a gap in revenue that affects both activities and staff's continued employment. - A Lifeline for Working Families Affected by COVID-19 Crisis; United

 source of cash assistance to economically vulnerable residents, including

<u>Federal and State-level Resources and Announcements</u>

- Baker-Polito Administration Launches Online Portal for Personal Protective Equipment, Volunteers to Support COVID-19 Outbreak, 3/29
- The <u>Paycheck Protection Program</u> is a loan designed to provide a direct incentive for small businesses to keep their workers on the payroll. SBA will forgive loans if all employees are kept on the payroll for eight weeks and the money is used for payroll, rent, mortgage interest, or utilities. The Paycheck Protection Program will be available through June 30, 2020.

Local Resources

- Mayor Walsh announced the creation of the <u>Small Business Relief Fund</u>,
 established to assist Boston's small businesses most directly impacted by
 closures, policies, or general loss of revenue due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
 This newly created fund is designed to quickly and strategically disburse
 grants to local businesses through a streamlined process that does not require
 businesses to assume additional debt. The Fund will begin accepting
 applications on Monday, April 6, 2020
